The impetus for this event is the need for community members to be able to get information about energy reduction, what it costs, how much can be saved, how to do it, and to find out about organisations that support local citizens to move to reducing energy consumption and to expanding renewable energy.

The exciting news that the government has decided to launch a Feed In Tariff or (FIT) which would pay households for any renewable energy they produced has created urgency and so this event is being organised. A similar Feed In Tariff has already made a major impact in Germany where 70% of renewable energy produced is attributed to the Feed In Tariff.

Sustainable Streatham (SuS) is a community organisation which began when a small but passionate group decided to act locally on climate change. SuS is an umbrella group which alongside this Energy Group currently boasts a Food Group, a Film & Campaigning Group, a Re-duce, Re-use & Recycling Group, as well as individuals leading drives to map green spaces in Streatham and is engaging with the community and local government to promote sustainable living in Streatham. SuS is also hopes to launch an Outreach & Education Group and a Transportation Group.
